from the power grid. Vehicles running on electricity produce no tailpipe emissions. The only emissions that can be attributed to electric vehicles are those generated in the production process at the power plant. The electric grid is an easily accessible driving energy.

Electricity fueling costs for electric vehicles are reasonable compared to gasoline, especially if consumers take advantage of off-peak rates. However, electricity costs vary across the U.S. depending on location, type of generation, time of use and access point (home, business, etc). Which EVs Qualify for the \$7,500 Tax Credit?

As more models may qualify as the 2024 year continues, find out which current vehicles would apply for the EV tax credit.

As of January 1, 2024 and on, credit eligibility and amount will be determined using the **IRS Energy Credits Online** website at the time of the vehicle sale. The dealer is required to complete and provide a copy of the time-of-sale report, which is needed to claim the credit incentive.

If the vehicle is eligible for the credit there are then two options:

- 1. Using Form 8936 to claim the credit on the year's tax return.
- 2. Transfer the credit to the dealer so then they could apply that credit amount to your final purchase cost. Allowing you to receive the credit benefit at the time of the sale. Form 8936 must still be filled out.



Clean Fuels Conference in Fort Worth, Lassoing Top Talent & Topics


